WEED OF THE WEEK-TALL BUTTERCUP

Identification

Tall Buttercup, also known as Common Buttercup, is a noxious weed native to Europe. It contains a bitter juice, which causes blistering of the mouth and digestive system when consumed by livestock. It is toxic to livestock and should not be grazed.

Flower Flowers are bright yellow and waxy with 5 petals

LeavesLower leaves are deeply divided into 3-5 lobes. Upper leaves are reduced to 3-4 narrow segments and are hairy.

Stem The stem is much branched above, and grows to 90cm tall

Control

Use herbicides registered to control. Install drainage ditches or tiles if practical since they thrive in moist soils. A close mowing during early bloom, following by a second cutting during late summer, will keep this weed under control in permanent pastures
