As a visitor to Long Island Lake Municipal Campground you must follow [Parks Bylaw No. 05-2019](#) and [7200-001 Fee Based Campgrounds Policy](#). these rules and regulations are to protect the natural environment and to ensure your health and safety, please respect your neighbors and the lands.

ALL RULES AND RESTRICTIONS ARE SUBJECT TO PENALTIES AND FINES IF NOT ADHERED TO.

Camping Rules and Regulations

As a visitor to Long Island Lake Municipal Campground, you must follow certain rules to protect the natural environment and to ensure your health and safety. Visitors found in violation of rules may face removal from these facilities, fines and the possibility of legal action.

Campground Camping

- Check-In Time is 6 p.m./Check-Out Time is 4 p.m. You must be 18 years of age or older to register for a campsite.
- Use of picnic sites, swimming beaches and other day use areas only between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.
- All visitors **must** obtain a Day Use permit and park in the Day Use parking area.
- Maximum length of stay is 14 days.
- A single site may be used by up to 6 persons, one (1) camping unit and two (two) motorized units and one (1) towed equipment combination for a maximum of three (3) pieces. All units must be contained to the site area. (Not all sites are capable of holding extra vehicles and vehicle/boat trailers sites may vary). A small tent may be put up for children.
- Some sites hold more than one camping accommodation. The Park Officer and/or the County may allow additional units with a permit for an additional full camping fee.
- Permit holders are responsible for the actions of all camping party members and any visitors to the campsite, which may include damage to a campsite. Each additional vehicle is required to purchase a day use permit and shall park in the site or designated public parking lots.
- Only the person whose name is on the reservation has access to change or cancel.
- Only registered campers are permitted after 11 p.m.
- Camping is only allowed in designated camping sites. Do not camp in the woods or on grass.
- Westlock County is not responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.
- Quiet times are from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. Turn off all music, generators and refrain from any loud activities.
- Pets must always be tethered or on a leash no longer than 8 feet at all times. Pets are not allowed in any public areas; the beach, park/grass, boat launch or swimming areas. Pets are not to be left barking or unattended. Owners are responsible for cleaning up waste from their pets.
- Use of fireworks or other explosives is prohibited in Long Island Lake Municipal Campground.

- In accordance with the *Alberta Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis Act*, alcohol and cannabis are restricted to registered campsites.

Keep Sites Clean

- Keep your site clean of all litter and waste.
- Discard any sunflower seeds, nut shells or cigarette butts lying around into the garbage not fire pits.
- Throw all garbage and litter in bins provided or take it with you.
- Prevent pollution. Keep garbage, litter and foreign substances out of the lake, streams and other water.
- Do not throw garbage, litter, fish cleanings or other foreign substances in toilets or fire pits.
- Wastewater must be disposed of in the approved Sani Station which is available for registered campers only.

Campfire Safety

- Firewood is available for purchase Do not carve, chop, cut or damage any live trees or vegetation, wood brought in may be prohibited
- Obey restrictions on fires. Fires may be limited or prohibited at certain times.
- Build fires only in designated pits. Pits are not to be moved.
- Do not put cans, bottles, plastic, cigarette butts, seed shells, food or rocks in fire pits.
- Do not start campfires with gasoline or camping fuel. Keep flammable fuels away from campfires.
- YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KEEPING FIRES UNDER CONTROL.
- Never leave your fire unattended. Be sure your fire is completely extinguished before leaving your site or going to sleep at night.

Operation of Vehicles

- Obey all traffic signs within the campground.
- The campground speed limit is 15 km/h. Always reverse with extreme caution.
- When operating vehicles of any kind, do not damage the land or vegetation, or disturb wildlife.
- **ALL OHV** vehicles including quads, ATV, off-road vehicles and motorbikes may not be operated in the campground and are only allowed in and out on trailers.
- Do not block, restrict, or interfere with the use of roads or trails.

Vehicle and Contents Left At Owners Risk, Westlock County is not responsible for any damages or theft that may occur during permitted use.

I understand that my access to Long Island Lake Municipal Campground may involve risk of physical injury to me or others, or damage to my property, or other consequences, which might result from my own actions, and/or the actions, inactions or negligence of others.

I unequivocally agree to assume any and all risks for injury to person or property, or any other consequence arising from my visitation of the Campground.
